Very quickly he found himself standing before an impressive angelic being with a clipboard who started getting his entry data down. After name, address, and a few other particulars, the angelic being said, "Fred, it would help the process if you could share with me some experience from your life on earth when you did a purely unselfish, kindly deed." Well, Fred thought about it for a minute and then said, "Oh, yes. I think I have something you might be interested in. One day I was walking along and I came upon a little old lady who was being mercilessly beaten up by a huge motorcycle gang type of fellow. He was smacking her back and forth. Well, I just stepped right up and first I pushed over his motorcycle-just to distract his attention. And then I kicked him real hard in the shins and told the old lady to run for help. And then I hauled off and gave the guy a great shot right to the gut with my fist."

This world is in darkness and people are blinded to the truth. They need Jesus' light. We are to let his light shine, but sometimes we are timid or afraid. So, why is it so important to shine his light? (Short answer... Jesus said to, Matthew 5:16)

THELL IS A REAL PLACE

A USA Today poll discovered 52% of adults are certain that there is a hell, and 27% think there might be.

--Nelson's Bible Dictionary... Hell, as a place of punishment, translates Gehenna, the Greek form of the Hebrew word that means "the valley of Hinnom" - a valley just south of Jerusalem. In this



valley the Canaanites worshiped Baal and the fire-god Molech by sacrificing their children in a fire that burned continuously.

In the time of Jesus, the Valley of Hinnom was used as the garbage dump of Jerusalem. Into it were thrown all the filth and garbage of the city, including the dead bodies of animals and executed criminals. To consume all this, fires burned constantly. Maggots worked in the filth. When the wind blew from that direction over the city, its awfulness was quite evident. At night wild dogs howled and gnashed their teeth as they fought over the garbage.

Jesus used this awful scene as a symbol of hell. In effect he said, "Do you want to know what hell is like? Look at the valley of Gehenna." So, hell may be described as God's "cosmic garbage dump." All that is unfit for heaven will be thrown into hell.

Hell is described as a place where "the worm does not die and the fire is not quenched." Repeatedly Jesus spoke of outer darkness and a furnace of fire, where there will be wailing, weeping, and gnashing of teeth. Obviously, this picture is drawn from the valley of Gehenna.

Because of the symbolic nature of the language, some people question whether hell consists of actual fire. Such reasoning should bring no comfort to the lost. The reality is greater than the symbol. The Bible exhausts human language in describing hell. Hell is more terrible than language can express.

2 Thessalonians 1:9

They will be punished with <u>everlasting destruction</u> and <u>shut out from the presence of the Lord</u> and from the majesty of his power.

The essence of hell is complete separation from God, and that is the ultimate disaster.

--Chuck Swindoll... Here are a few characteristics of hell set forth in the N.T.:

* It is a place where people scream for mercy, have memories, are tormented, feel alone, cannot escape (Luke 16:23-31).

- * It is a place of unquenchable fire (Mark 9:48).
- * It is a place of darkness (Revelation 9:2).
- * It is a place where God's wrath is poured out (Rev. 14:10).

* It is a place of everlasting destruction (2 Thessalonians 1:9).

--Leith Anderson... My family and I have lived in the same house for seventeen years. We've lived there more than twice as long as I have lived at any other address in my entire life. I'll sometimes refer to it as "our house," but more often I refer to it as "home." What makes it home isn't the address or the lot or the garage or the architecture. You may live in a bigger or newer or better house than we live in, but as nice as your house may be, I would never refer to your house as home because the people who are most important to me don't live there. So, what makes home, home, is the people in the relationships.

Actually, I think that heaven is far greater than our wildest imagination. What makes heaven, heaven, is God. It is being there with him. With his presence comes peace and contentment, a fulfillment, a sense that all is well. That is also a contentment that bubbles over into the rest of life.
